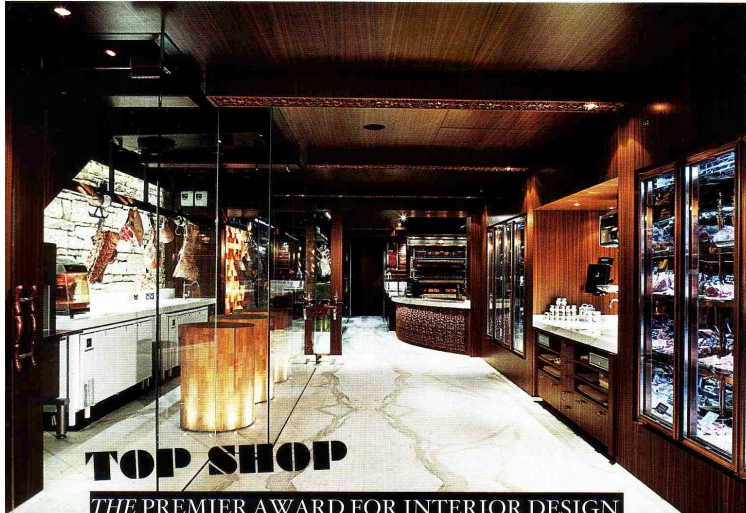

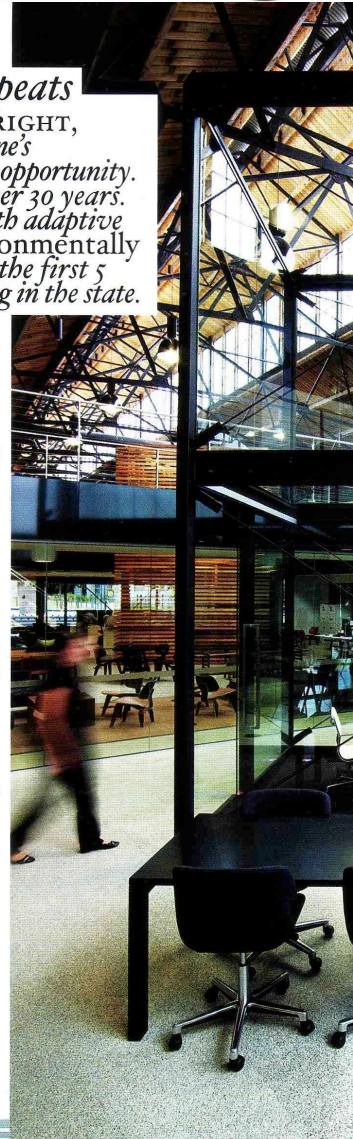
### History repeats

The refurbishment of the Goods Shed North, RIGHT, a heritage-listed railway goods shed in Melbourne's Docklands, presented BVN Architects a unique opportunity. Built in 1889, the shed had been derelict for over 30 years. Its transformation into a vibrant workplace with adaptive re-use of building stock earned them the Environmentally Sustainable Design Award. The building is the first 5 Star Green Star-certified heritage-listed building in the state.

### BEACH BLISS

Winner of the Award For Residential Interior Decoration, Coastal Retreat by Hare + Klein Interior Design, is relaxing, comfortable, practical and robust. The building, LEFT, possesses a sense of escape and an immediate natural synergy with the ocean, spilling over conventional interior boundaries to make the transition between interior and exterior seamless. Outside elements have been treated with as much care as interior ones. Washed colours of the beach and sea gave cues for a natural and bleached background palette with weatherproof materials such as sandblasted oregon, stone, zinc and concrete, creating the impression of a house that has evolved over time.
